## Content Covered This Week

Math
Beginning Unit 1- next week
We have done comprehensive testing in math fact fluency, math computation skills for two digit numbers, as well as the I-Ready program. We will be introducing flexible groupings; therefore your child will be able to receive instruction that is tailored to his/her individual need. The students do a whole group lesson with student leaders, and then get group practice with workbook pages. The students have an opportunity to work in groups given an activity to card where they have to solve with their partner, and then write in their math journal using mathtalk according to their math prompt. ## Reading

Book: Westlandia
Big Idea: How is interdependence essential to maintaining life? Idioms of the Week: Bent Out of Shape \& Feeling Blue
We read the book Weslandia, which introduces the concept of civilization and interdependence. The students worked on defining unknown vocabulary and describing what each word means to them. The students are using this text to provide evidence in their writing. Next week, they will begin creating their own civilization.
Writing- Westlandia Opinion, Baseline Summer
The students are learning what TTQA means (turn the question around), how to provide evidence from the text, and how to justify their thinking. The students wrote about their summer vacation, that they used to go back in and see what they can change or add to improve their writing. The students are working on responding to an opinion writing prompt on Westlandia using evidence from the text.
