Content Covered This Week

Math

Unit 1: Equivalent Fractions- 1.6, 1.7

Strategies were introduced on how to change mixed numbers into improper fractions and improper fractions into mixed numbers. We have also introduced adding and subtracting fractions with like and unalike denominators. The students are provided opportunities to work on a whole group lesson with student leaders, and then get group practice with workbook pages. The students have an opportunity to work in groups given an activity card, which they solve with their partner, and then write in their math journal using mathtalk according to their math prompt. Continue to work on math facts!

Reading

Book: Science book, worksheets (Weather)

Big Idea: How is interdependence essential to maintaining life? Idioms of the Week: Drive a Lemon &

Our Science Unit on weather is incorporated within our reading block. We are discussing the layers of the atmosphere and types of wind in our Science book and related articles/ worksheets. The students performed a lab on air pressure, and created vocabulary note cards and took Cornell notes, which will help them study for their upcoming Science test.

Writing-Being a Writer, Research

Your child is continuing to practice TTQA, providing evidence from text, and justifying his/her thinking. Students are learning to get ideas for writing from their own life experiences. They will also be required to create a short research essay on a question of interest to them concerning science weather topics. Then they will write an essay citing evidence from that research.
