Content Covered This Week

Math

Unit 1: Equivalent Fractions- 1.3, 1.4, and 1.5

We have introduced discussed how to make chain equivalent fractions, comparing fractions, and creating mixed numbers. The students do a whole group lesson with student leaders, and then get group practice with workbook pages. The students have an opportunity to work in groups given an activity card to solve with their partner, and then write in their math journal using mathtalk according to their math prompt. Continue to work on math facts!

Reading

Book: The Lemonade Club

Big Idea: How is interdependence essential to maintaining life? Idioms of the Week: Couch Potato & Walking on Eggshells

Science: Weather

We read the book *The Lemonade Club*, which describes the interdependence of people on each other. We introduced guided notes and Diamante Poems that the students are busy creating. At the end of the week we have incorporated the layers of the atmosphere for Science during Reading.

Writing- Westlandia (Opinion)

The students are learning what TTQA means (turn the question around), how to provide evidence from the text, and how to justify their thinking. The students continued to work on their civilization brochures.
